Publication of SIAMS report for Ann Edwards Church of England Primary School

Dear Parents and Carers

I am delighted to be writing to you with our SIAMS report. SIAMS stands for the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools and occurs at a similar frequency to Ofsted inspections.

We were inspected on Thursday 5th October against the criteria listed below, with the inspector scrutinising a broad evidence base which included lesson observations; scrutiny of pupils' work; meetings with leaders, staff, governors, children and parents/carers; review of the website; meeting with representatives of the church; review of attendance, suspension, exclusion and behaviour records; interrogation of strategic documents such as the school development plan and self-evaluation. We felt at the end of the day that the inspector had followed a robust, professional process and gained a deep insight into our school and our place in our community.


SIAMS Criteria:

- Context of the school: Who are we and what are we doing here? (What is the school's unique context and how does that inform the vision? How is the vision lived out?)
- How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision enable pupils and adults to flourish?
- How does the curriculum reflect the school's theologically rooted Christian vision?
- How is collective worship enabling pupils and adults to flourish spiritually?
- How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create an active culture of justice and responsibility?
- Is the religious education curriculum effective?
- How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create a culture in which pupils and adults are treated well?

We are delighted to have been assessed at the highest level possible with only two development points identified. I believe these next steps to be fair and we have begun addressing them; they will form part of our new strategic plan.
